History—HMS Druid was a 16-gun sloop, formerly in civilian service under the name Brilliant. She was purchased in 1776, converted into a fire ship and renamed HMS Blast in 1779, and was finally sold in 1783

British Royal Navy gunboat No. Druid. Druid number is the Royal Navy ship construction standards representatives. American War of Independence broke out, the Royal Navy needed a size smaller boat to meet the urgent needs of a shortage of materials. To meet this demand, the Royal Navy to transform an existing merchant ships, Druid Road is a good example. Druid Road in July 1775 in Virginia built a displacement of 250 tons, in August 1776 by the Royal Navy purchased and converted into warships, equipped with 14 guns and six pounds guns 24 pounds, the main task is to transport the tobacco as well as other merchant escorts. No. Druid fleet where there are five pairs of masts owned ships and four other types of warships and shuttles between Europe and the Americas.
